# Registration Information

- Registration Forms
- When a child is registering in District 204 for the first time, a parent or guardian must provide proof of identity and age by providing one of the following documents:
  - Original or certified copy of a birth certificate (must be five years old by September 1, 2018 – no exceptions)
  - Valid passport, or
  - Other record recognized by a court of law (ex: adoption certificate)
- Copy of Official County Birth Certificate (must be 5 years old by September 1, 2018 - no exceptions)
- Proof of Residency (3 items)
- Physical and Immunization Forms

# Health Requirements & Immunizations



- Illinois State Physical/Immunization form due prior to the first day of school
- Vision exam due by mid-October 2018
- Dental exam due by mid-May 2019






# Preparing your child for Kindergarten...

## Academics

- Build your child's stamina by getting him or her to stay on one task for an extended period of time (games, coloring, etc.).
- Work on learning how to distinguish between letters, numbers and symbols in various fonts (while driving point out signs, look through magazines).
- Take your child to various places (zoo, library, museum, grocery store) to build background knowledge.
- Practice with your child to learn basic numbers, colors, and letters.

# Preparing your child for Kindergarten...

## Social Emotional and Motor Skills

- Help your child to build patience (waiting his or her turn, not interrupting).
- Encourage independent problem solving.
- Practice having your child advocate for themselves to meet their needs and wants.
- Practice buttoning, zipping and tying shoes independently.
- Remind your child to wash hands before eating and after using the bathroom or playing outside.
- Teach your child to be independent with meals.

# Preparing parents for Kindergarten...

- Establish and review routines with your child. Consider walking routes, others who have permission to transport them, safety rules, etc. If your child will be taking the school bus, show them the stop's location and your expectations for getting to and from school safely.
- Make home a place for learning. Designate a special spot for practicing skills together, displaying school work, etc.
- Read to your child frequently for pleasure. Look at books and magazines together. Make sure they see you reading!




# First Days of School

The first day of Kindergarten (**Tuesday, August 21, 2018**) is a shortened orientation day designed for students, parents and guardians.

- On **Tuesday, August 21**, the first day of the 2018-2019 school year, Kindergarten students and their parents will attend a 1 hour Kindergarten Orientation in their assigned teacher's classroom. During Kindergarten Orientation, Kindergarten students and their families will learn about the Kindergarten day and they will take a tour of the building.
- **Kindergarten Orientation Tuesday, August 21, 2018**  
A-M: 10:00 AM – 11:00 AM  
N-Z: 1:30 PM – 2:30 PM
- If your scheduled orientation time does not work for your family, you may attend the other session.

# First Days of School

**The first full day of Kindergarten will occur on  
Wednesday, August 22, 2018.**

**9:15 am – 3:35 pm**

Allow plenty of time to get ready and travel on the first day of regular attendance for kindergarten so that your child doesn't feel rushed. It is recommended that you begin their normal arrival routine on that day.

# First Days of School

## ➤ How do Kindergarten students know how to get to their classroom? Do Kindergarten students walk to the classroom by themselves?

- During the first two weeks of school adults are posted throughout the building to help guide Kindergarten students to their classrooms. All of these adults have a puppet (Annie) that is used to help guide Kindergarten students to their classroom. Kindergarten students will be shown Annie at Kindergarten Orientation.
- We do encourage Kindergarten students to enter the building and go to their classroom without their parents. This helps to build their independence and self-confidence.



# First Days of School

- **When will I find out about the bus routes and schedule?**
  - Bus routes and schedules will be available online in August.
- **When will I receive my child's teacher assignment?**
  - Teacher assignments are available in August by logging in to E-School with your child's information. More information will be coming about how to log in.

# Frequently Asked Questions

- **How long is lunchtime for students?**
  - Lunch is 20 minutes and recess is 15 minutes. If students need additional time to eat we allow them to finish their lunch during recess time.

## ▪ **How much does lunch cost?**

- Currently, the cost of Lunch is \$2.65. White Milk is \$0.60 and Chocolate Milk is \$0.70.

## ▪ **What if my child has a food allergy or other health concern?**

- Parents will have the opportunity to share this information with the school nurse and office staff in the registration packet.
- Students with severe peanut or other nut allergies have the opportunity to sit at a peanut free table during lunchtime.

# Frequently Asked Questions

- **What are the building security procedures?**
  - Doors are locked at all times.
  - Visitors are “buzzed” in through the main office
  - Guests/visitors show their picture ID, leave their ID with the office staff, and are given a visitor’s badge.

# Frequently Asked Questions

- **When do Gifted Services Begin?**
  - Testing for the identification of gifted students occurs in 2nd grade and actual gifted programming begins in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade.
  - Kindergarten teachers differentiate their instruction to meet the needs of all students as well as to make sure that every child is challenged at their level.

- **What are the arrival and dismissal procedures?**
  - The **car drop-off and pick-up** line is the safest and easiest way to drop off car riders
  - Walkers can enter any door...but exit through "Kindergarten Door (Door #3)"
  - All students are required to have a completed **Arrival and Dismissal Form** on file
